Why does my baby need a detailed hearing test?

If your baby does not pass the hearing screenings, then you will receive a letter or report that reads “referred”. This means your baby will need a detailed hearing test.

Did you know?

- Further testing is the only way to know if your baby really has a hearing loss.
- Identifying a hearing loss as early as possible is critical to your baby’s speech and language development.
- If your baby has a hearing loss, there are many ways you can get help for your baby.



What will happen during the detailed hearing test?

A more detailed hearing test will be done by an Audiologist (health care professional with a specialty in hearing loss). The evaluation may include several other tests to get a complete picture of your baby’s hearing. This test should be done as soon as possible before your baby is three months of age.

What’s the next step?

Contact an audiology clinic to make an appointment.

- Ask for any special instructions to prepare your baby for the evaluation
- You may need a referral from your doctor prior to this appointment

Early hearing testing is very important. Identifying a hearing loss as early as possible will get your child off to a good start in their communication development. It is important that you keep all appointments and follow up with your child’s results.



Remember...

- A detailed hearing test is the only way to know if your child really has a hearing loss.

- Early communication development is important for your child’s future.
